Freeholder Director Lee Ware has announced that the Board of Chosen Freeholders, in cooperation with the New Jersey Farm Bureau, will be holding a local rally on **Wednesday, April 2, 2008 at 11 AM** to protest the proposed elimination of the New Jersey Department of Agriculture. "We will be joining with our colleagues throughout the region to show solidarity with the farming community in urging the Garden State to keep the Department of Agriculture," said Director Ware. The Department of Agriculture has been an effective advocate for the New Jersey farming community and it is imperative that it remain as such for years to come."
